To Whom It May Concern,

My name is Sandifer Deer. I am the general manager and chief systems design engineer for E-Squared Systems. I have been engaged in the low voltage industry in Washington State continuously since 1993. I hold a Washington State EL06 electrical license, ME06 Master electrical license as well as NICET IV in Fire alarm systems.

This letter is presented with our proposal for the fire alarm upgrade and to provide recommendations for both the correctional facility and industrial building fire alarm systems.

Bid Request (1) Supply, install, and test a fire alarm system in the City's Correctional Facility located at Forks City Hall, 500 East Division Street, Forks, Washington

Regarding the correctional facility fire alarm system, the existing system is an Edwards EST 2. The bid request is to upgrade the existing system, not replace it. The requested upgrade equipment is Silent Knight. The two manufacturers are mutually exclusive. An upgrade for the existing EST 2 to any other manufacturer would necessitate a full replacement. Additionally, the bid request Silent Knight equipment quantities do not match existing site quantities. For instance, 40 new smoke detectors are requested, there are approximately only 19 existing. Four duct detectors are requested for which there are a minimum of 14 existing. The site has several initiating devices such as sprinkler tampers and waterflow for which no replacement input modules are requested. There are 4 very old electro-mechanical horns for which no replacements are included.

From the site walk it has been established that the existing fire alarm system consists of an older fire alarm panel and legacy equipment mixing both conventional and addressable parts. A total of four notification devices were noted throughout the facility. Pull stations are required at all admin and court area required exits.

Recommendations:

(1) The existing fire alarm device layout, for both the initiating (smokes, heats, pulls) and notification (horns and horn/strobes), is not code compliant to current IFC/IBC standards, NEC nor NFPA 72 requirements. Device and panel replacements are expected to occur over the course of time. When required this does not necessarily dictate requirements to bringing a building up to current-code compliance. However, it is generally a good idea.

The admin/PD and Court areas are generally considered to be Group B occupancy. Group B occupancy requires manual pull stations and notification throughout specified areas. In general, these include common work areas and public spaces.

Recommended Action:

- a. Replace EST with Silent Knight Panel.
- Replace existing Edwards addressable devices and all conventional devices with Silent Knight like-in-kind versions
- c. Add pull stations at exits not currently provisioned. All exits are currently provisioned.
- d. Replace the 4 four existing notification devices with new horn/strobes.

This is essentially provide the "upgrade" to existing devices. Additionally, I would recommend the following;

- e. Add notification in all required areas and the exterior of the building. There are many areas of the non-correctional portions of the facility that lack current code cycle required occupancy notification. Floor 2 and floor 3 spaces if continued to be used as storage would not necessarily require notification.
- f. Replace the non-required smoke detectors as requested. The admin area smoke detectors appear to be the discontinued IONIZATION type detectors. These style detectors use a radio-active isotope and must be properly disposed of. There is generally an added cost for this special disposal. Replace these devices with photo-electric or remove from system as code allows. If smoke detection is to remain there should be a consistent layout (i.e. full detection, full egress detection in all areas or spot detection where called by NFPA 72 such as at control panels.
- g. Add heat detection to the attic spaces.
- h. Clean up all exposed cabling. Reroute and properly secure to structure were required. The attic mechanical spaces have wiring run in haphazard manner and present a safety concern for travelling through the spaces.
- (2) Assess and evaluate, with recommendations as to any needed modifications or improvements of the fire alarm and suppression system at the Forks Industrial Building located 143 Sitkum-Sol Duc Road, Forks, Washington.

The industrial building has a dry sprinkler system with a single pressure switch. The interior of the building has several inches of standing water over a large portion of the floor. The standing water is pooled around the service gear and breaker panels. It is unknown if power is turned on to the building.

The pump house has a small air-compressor that appears to be for maintaining pressure on the dry pipes. The compressor is disconnected from both power and the sprinkler system. Power cabling to the pump house (5) appears to be dismantled over the compressor.

The associated nearby PIV does not have a monitoring switch.

Recommendation:

- a. For utilization purposes, the sprinkler system should be inspected and tested by a sprinkler service company. Power should be verified and re-established to the pump house and the compressor recommissioned or replaced and put into service. The pump house should be dried in and sealed against weather.
- b. For remote monitoring service of the sprinkler system, a small fire panel with a communication ability such as a cellular unit can be installed. If such is the case, a smoke detector, pull station and notification bell or horn/strobe should be provided

according to current code minimum standards. It is possible to simply provide monitoring only of the sprinkler pressure switch via a communicator. If the building is to be occupied at some point a local audible or audible/visual should be provided on waterflow activation for site personnel or approaching fire department vehicles. In any case, permanent power to the pump house will need to be established. A cellular unit is recommended provided there is adequate signal to the general vicinity in lieu of phone lines or radio. (Note: I had 3 bars at the building with Verizon).

ON behalf of E-Squared Systems, I thank you for the opportunity to be of service and provide proposal and recommendations for this project.



Dear Councilmembers, Commissioners, and Clerk,

I am writing as a concerned property owner to formally submit a complaint under RCW 42.36, the Appearance of Fairness Doctrine, regarding a potential conflict of interest in the permitting process for the proposed wireless communication tower by Vertical Bridge REIT, LLC.

Background and Concern:

It has come to my attention that **Mr. Rod Fleck**, who serves as both **City Attorney** and a **signatory on the lease agreement** between the City of Forks and Vertical Bridge, also played an advisory and potentially decision-shaping role in the related planning and permitting process.

Specifically, Mr. Fleck:

- 1 Signed or approved the lease agreement between the City of Forks and Vertical Bridge as a representative of the city;
 - 2 Provided legal counsel to the Planning Commission regarding the same project;
 - 3 Engaged in communication with Vertical Bridge in a representative capacity;
- 4 Failed to disclose a conflict of interest or recuse himself, despite having a direct role in the lease negotiation and execution.

This presents an **actual or perceived conflict of interest** under the Appearance of Fairness Doctrine, which requires impartiality in quasi-judicial proceedings and mandates the **recusal of any official** whose impartiality might reasonably be questioned.

RCW 42.36.060 states:

"If such violation is discovered before the rendering of a decision, it shall be disclosed and the disqualified person shall withdraw from the proceedings. The failure to disclose the disqualification may render the decision void."

This standard has been upheld in multiple Washington court rulings, where even the **appearance** of bias or undue influence has been deemed sufficient to vacate land use decisions.

Requested Actions:

- Immediate recusal of Mr. Fleck from any current or future involvement, advisory or administrative, in this matter;
 - Appointment of independent legal counsel to the Planning Commission for continued



deliberation;

- **Disclosure and release of all communications** between Mr. Fleck and representatives of Vertical Bridge;
 - · Nullification and review of any permits or decisions made under this conflict;
- Reopening of the public comment period if the integrity of the original process is determined to have been compromised.

I respectfully request this complaint be entered into the **official public record** concerning the Vertical Bridge proposal and that the City provide **written confirmation of receipt** and a timeline for response or hearing on this matter.

Thank you for your attention and your commitment to public integrity and transparency.

Also an **easement overreach** by the city to cross the corner of my property which I will be seeking legal representation for if this permit is not withdrawn. Any further communications from you "the city" I'd like in email form.
